She was born again from above by water and the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism on February 5, 1956 at Alma United Methodist Church in Alma, MI, with Pastor Charles Hahn officiating. Her mother, Lucile, was released from Alma United Methodist Church and became a Charter Member of Peace Lutheran in Alma, MI in December of 1962. Connie was Confirmed at Peace on June 25, 1967, with Pastor Ronald Mueller officiating. She loved, and was committed to, her Church Family and remained a faithful member of Peace until she was called home by our Lord this past Friday, December 2, 2011. It goes without saying that Connie will be dearly missed. But, we rejoice this morning, even in the midst of our sorrow, for we know that she now wears the crown of glory and enjoys unspeakable peace, joy, and comfort with the Lord and all His saints and angels in the paradise of heaven. The Remembrance of Baptism




