

Welcome

Welcome to the Lord's House for Divine Service on this Most Sacred of days. Good Friday is not observed as a funeral for Christ. It is a day for repentance over sin and restrained joy and praise for the redemption Christ accomplished for us on the cross. In keeping with this character, music is kept to a minimum, though not silenced. Elaborate words of praise and various parts of the Divine Liturgy are omitted. The altar, which was stripped bare last night, remains free of ornamental beauty and is adorned in black to remind us of our sin for which our Lord was crucified and to symbolize the darkness which fell over the land beginning at noon and lasting until three o'clock on that Sacred Day long ago. It goes without saying that silence should be observed before and after the Service to allow all to prayerfully meditate upon the Passion of Our Lord.

With the exception of the hymns and the Litany, the entire Service is printed out in the bulletin for your convenience. During this Sacred Time, we shall focus on the "Seven Words of Christ" from the Cross. A short homily on each of these Words shall take the place of the sermon.

Since this Sacred Day is observed in the spirit of restrained praise in thanks for the redemption Christ won on the cross, the Distribution of the Fruits of His Death in the Sacrament of His true Body and Blood is quite an appropriate way to proclaim and remember Him. Thus, the Blessed Sacrament shall be celebrated during our Service today.

At the conclusion of the Service, any who wish may remain as long as they like to continue to prayerfully meditate upon our Lord's Passion. The church will remain opened until 3:00 p.m., at which time there will be a short devotion to commemorate the hour in which our Lord gave up His Spirit.

The Lord be with us in Divine Service on this Most Holy of Days.

The Service of the Sacrament

(Communicants at our altar are to be in full confessional fellowship with the LCMS)

Hear us as we pray in His name and as He has taught us:

hallowed be Thy name,
Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven;
give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The Words of Institution

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

The Ringing of the Somber Bells

The Somber Bells, which set the tone for our Service, will ring six times symbolizing the six hours our Lord hung upon the Cross. At the conclusion of the sixth ring, all stand for the Collect of the Day.

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading

Isaiah 52:13-53:12

¹³Behold, my servant shall act wisely; he shall be high and lifted up, and shall be exalted. ¹⁴As many were astonished at you—his appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the children of mankind—¹⁵so shall he sprinkle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which has not been told them they see, and that which they have not heard they understand. ^{53:1}Who has believed what they heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? ²For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. ³He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

⁴Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. ⁵But he was wounded for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his stripes we are healed. ⁶All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

⁷He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. ⁸By oppression and judgment he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people? ⁹And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

¹⁰Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his

soul makes an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the Lord shall prosper in his hand. ¹¹Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. ¹²Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.
