The following article originally appeared in the November, 2006 edition of The Peace Post. I thought it was worth sharing again.

"Give Thanks to the LORD"

"Give thanks to the LORD, call on His Name; make known among the nations what He has done" (Psalm 105:1).

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

"Give thanks to the LORD" is a constant refrain heard throughout Scripture. God's chosen people should live their lives in constant thankfulness to Him. He is, after all, their sole source of all blessings. It is only from His gracious and loving hand that they have anything, including the breath of life that allows them to live in this world.

The meaning of the First Article of the Creed faithfully expresses why God's people should constantly give Him thanks:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my hody and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.

He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.

All this He does out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.

This is most certainly true.

That we should give thanks and praise to the LORD for all that He has done, and continues to do for us is, as Luther says, "most certainly true," and not one of God's people would disagree. The "why" we should give thanks to the LORD is obvious. But, what about the "how" we give thanks?

How do we give thanks to the LORD? That's the question. The answer is found in Luther's explanation above, that we "serve and obey Him." But, what does that mean?

It means more than what you may think. It means more than attending Divine Service and Bible Study regularly. It means more than praying to the LORD in both good and bad times. It means more than the gift you offer in the offering plate for the work of the Gospel to be done among us. All of those things are indeed faithful expressions of our thankfulness, service, and obedience to the LORD. However, there is more to it than that.

The last part of Psalm 105:1 above teaches us that we give full expression to our thankfulness when we "make known among the nations what He has done."

We make known what God has done by pointing people to Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, who lived a perfect, sinless life in our place and died on the cross for our sins. We show our thankfulness to the LORD when we serve Him by obeying His call to share the Gospel with others.

This Thanksgiving, as you gather with family and friends and enjoy the wonderful blessings the LORD has bestowed upon you, take time to give thanks to Him for everything He has provided you, especially for the salvation He has won for you through Jesus Christ. But, don't stop there. Give thanks to the LORD also by sharing the Gospel with family and friends who do not yet know Jesus as Savior. That, my friends in Christ, is how you give full expression of your thankfulness to the LORD.

May the LORD empower you to be His faithful witnesses in this sinful world, that you may make known to others what He has done in Jesus Christ. Amen!

DAILY DEVOTIONS

I am sometimes asked by people what I would recommend for their daily devotional life. My answer to them is that I can think of nothing better than to use the prayer/hymn book God has given us in the Bible, i.e., the Psalms. What follows below is a schedule for praying all of the Psalms each month. The schedule is set up for you to pray one or more Psalms in the morning before you begin your day and in the evening as you conclude your day. It doesn't take nearly as long as you might think. You could have this be the full content of your daily devotion or you could add other elements. A format I like to follow includes:

INTRODUCING FEAST DAY DIVINE SERVICES

Beginning on November 30, The Feast of St. Andrew, Apostle, we will begin having Divine Services on the various Feast and Festival days of the Historic Church Year. You can view a schedule of the Feasts and Festivals of the Church Year in the *Lutheran Service Book* on pages xxii-xxiii. We will not be able to celebrate every Feast/Festival Day, but we will celebrate as many as possible. These Divine Services will be held at Noon on the day the Feast/Festival falls and will be much like the Divine Services we had during Holy Week last year, except that they will be less meditative and more celebratory in nature. The liturgy and hymnody will be spoken and Holy Communion will be offered at each Service. They should last about 30-35 minutes in length, allowing anyone who works days to spend part of their lunch hour with us in the House of the Lord should they desire to do so.

We will continue the tradition of observing some of the major Festivals on the Sunday closest to the day on which they fall (e.g. Reformation Day and All Saints' Day). We will also continue to celebrate the Feast/Festival Days when they fall on Sundays. There are five Feast Days which fit that category in the upcoming Church Year (St. Matthias—2/24; St. Peter & St. Paul—6/29; St. Bartholomew—8/24; Holy Cross Day—9/14; St. Matthew—9/21).

Please check the calendar each month to see which Feast/Festival Days we will be celebrating. I hope and pray that many of you will be able to join us for these additional opportunities to be in the House of the Lord and to receive the precious gifts our Lord desires to give through His Holy Word and Sacraments. If you have any questions about these Feast/Festival Days, please see me anytime.

No Other Name but Jesus

In Acts 4, the religious leaders had Peter and John arrested because they were preaching the resurrection of Jesus, calling people to repentance and faith in Him as the Messiah and Savior. The religious leaders severely threatened them, commanding them that from that point forward they were not to speak to anyone in the name of Jesus or preach about Him. The Jewish leaders could accept ordinary and familiar talk of God, but any reference to Jesus, God in the flesh, the crucified and risen Savior from sin, would not be tolerated.

In response Peter and John said this, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than God, you judge . . . There is salvation in none other (than Jesus), for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." To fail to preach in the name of Jesus would be to deny God and the truth of salvation.

In many ways, we are faced today with a similar threat. To be sure, no one is demanding that we stop using the name of Jesus (though people do seem to be much more comfortable with generic "God" talk than with God-in-the-flesh Jesus talk). But there is one thing that our society won't tolerate, and that is the statement of Peter above, namely, that there is salvation in no one else but Jesus, and that all other ways and religions, therefore, lead away from salvation to damnation. Such a belief is considered arrogant and intolerant. We are supposed to be inclusive and tolerant of all beliefs, they say.

But how can we be tolerant of what is spiritually dangerous and untrue? How is it caring to tell our neighbor that his rejection of the Savior is OK? A god by any other name is not the true God. Jesus Himself said, "He who rejects Me rejects Him who sent Me." (Luke 10:16)

If we believe these words, then we will unashamedly and boldly speak the name of Jesus to our neighbor—that though we deserve death and hell because of our rebellion against God in thought, word, and deed, Jesus suffered death and hell for us on the cross, shedding His divine blood to make full payment for our sins and rising on the third day to conquer death and all evil. Through faith in Jesus we receive life with the Father as a free gift. Baptized in Jesus' name, our names are written in heaven. Truly, "there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."


