

#### Welcome

Welcome to the Lord's House this morning for the Funeral Service of Georgia H. Spindler. Georgia was born on June 17, 1922 in Flint, MI. She was born again from above with water and the Spirit through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism on November 11, 1952 at Jefferson Avenue Methodist Church in Saginaw, MI, with Pastor Arthur Smith officiating. She was Confirmed on December 15, 1953 at Zion Lutheran Church in Freeland, MI, with Pastor Ernest Spoehr officiating. Georgia and her husband, Emil, transferred their membership from Zion Lutheran in Freeland, MI to Peace Lutheran in Alma, MI to become Charter Members of the congregation on December 12, 1962, and both remained active and faithful members of Peace until our Lord called them home, Emil on December 25, 2004, and Georgia this past Thursday, June 30, 2011. It goes without saying that Georgia will be dearly missed. But, we rejoice this morning, even in the midst of our sorrow, for we know that Georgia now wears the crown of glory and enjoys unspeakable peace, joy, and comfort with the Lord and all His saints and angels in the paradise of heaven. Therefore, our Service this morning is a celebration of the life Georgia now lives in heaven; the same life which awaits all who have faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

# The Remembrance of Baptism

- P In Holy Baptism, Georgia Spindler was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all her sin. St. Paul says: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"

Georgia H. Spindler, age 89 of Alma, Michigan was called home to her Lord on Thursday, June 30, 2011 at Masonic Pathways in Alma.

Georgia was born in Flint, Michigan on June 17, 1922, the daughter of Bert E. and Katherine (Brown) Hiles. She had graduated from Saginaw High School.

On August 22, 1953 she married Emil Spindler at Zion Lutheran Church in Freeland, Michigan. Emil died December 25, 2004. She had resided most of her life in St. Louis, Michigan and was a charter member of Peace Lutheran Church.

Georgia had worked for General Motors from 1941 to 1953; she also worked at Consumers Power Co. and State Farm Insurance. She was the church secretary at Peace Lutheran Church. 




