
Holy Communion Practice

The Blessing of Our New Chalice

- P: Beloved in the Lord, in perfect love for us Jesus Christ, our God and Lord, became incarnate, died, and rose for our sake. He bestows the benefits of His redeeming work on us as He places His Body and Blood into our mouths in the Sacrament of the Altar. It is therefore fitting and right that the vessels used to convey to us His Body and Blood should be sanctified by the Word of God and prayer.

- C: who made heaven and earth.
- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And with thy spirit.
- P: Let us pray: Most gracious God and Father, whose only-begotten Son instituted the Blessed Sacrament of His Body and Blood, bless this chalice for use at the altar of Your Church. Grant that all who drink the Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ from this vessel may rejoice in the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation given to them in this Sacrament; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
