

From the Desk of Pastor Messer "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord?"



The 19th century African American spiritual, which has become a fixed ingredient within Good Friday Services almost everywhere today, asks the question, "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" The composer of this hymn (LSB 456) is unknown. I wonder if the writer of this hymn, whoever he/she was, knew the answer to the question. The answer, of course, is, "Yes." You were there. So was I. So was the unknown composer of this hymn. Every sinful human being who has ever lived was there.

Not only were we all there, but we were the ones crucifying our Lord. We were the ones nailing Him to the tree. We were the ones laying Him in the tomb. As Dr. Luther taught, if you are to meditate upon your Lord's sufferings and death properly, you must "deeply believe and never doubt in the least that you are the one who thus martyred Christ. For your sins most surely did it." As hard as it is for us to admit, we are the ones who betrayed Jesus, denied Him, spit on Him, scourged Him, and hammered Him to the tree of the cross. We killed the Author of Life, our Emmanuel, shedding His Holy Blood with our sins.

The discipline of Lent has called upon us to examine ourselves; to look into the mirror of God's Holy Law and recognize our sinfulness. As we embark upon Holy Week, the call for self-examination is increased; for as we travel the *via delorosa* with our Lord to Calvary, it is only as we see ourselves in the cast of characters responsible for putting Jesus to death that we will be led to true repentance. Then, and only then, can our eyes be opened to see the Good News of that sorrowful Friday long ago, namely that our Lord Jesus Christ willingly took our sins upon Himself and suffered and died for them. He died for us, that we might live in Him. He suffered the wrath and punishment we deserve for our sins, that we might be forgiven and set free. We killed Him with our sins, but He allowed us to do so, that He might bury our sins in the tomb and remember them no more.

"And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Myself," said our Lord (John 12:32). On the cross, He fulfills this promise. He draws all people—from Adam until those alive when He returns on the Last Day—to Himself on the cross, absorbing the sins of all into His own Holy, Innocent Body to make full atonement. Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Yes, you were. So was I. All people were. In fact, we would do well to turn that question into a confession: I was there when I crucified my Lord. That recognition is what should cause us to tremble, tremble, tremble.



ST. ROMANOS THE MELODIST "AGAIN TO PARADISE"

Pilate fixed three crosses on Golgotha: two for the thieves, and one for the Giver of life. When Hell saw it, he said to those below, "My ministers and powers, who has fixed a nail in my heart? A wooden lance has suddenly pierced me and I am being torn apart! My insides are in pain, my belly in agony, my senses make my spirit tremble, and I am compelled to disgorge Adam and Adam's race. All men were given to me by the Garden's tree–but now a tree is bringing them back again to Paradise."

When he heard this, Satan, the cunning serpent ran crawling and said, "What is it, hell? Why do you groan for no reason? Why produce

these wailings? This Tree, at which you tremble, I carpentered up there for Mary's Child. I suggested it to his enemies for our advantage, for it is a Cross, to which I have nailed Christ, wishing by a tree to do away with the second Adam, just as I did away with the first one. So do not be afraid. It is dry and barren. It will not harm you. Keep hold of those you have. Of those we rule, not one will escape again to Paradise."

Hell replied to Satan, "You have lost your senses—you, the cunning snake of old! All your wisdom has been swallowed up by the cross, and you have been caught in your own snare. Lift up your eyes and see that you have fallen into the pit you dug! Behold that Tree, which you call dry and barren, bears fruit: a thief tasted it and has

become heir to the good things of Eden. Moses' rod led the people out of Egypt, but this tree brings mankind back again to Paradise."

Satan answered, "Wretched hell-cease this cowardly talk! Your words reveal your thoughts. Are you afraid of a cross and of the Crucified? Not one of your words has shaken me, for these deeds are part of my plan. I will also open a grave and entomb Christ, so that you may enjoy your cowardice doubly-from his tomb as well as from his cross. When I see you, I will mock you. For when Christ is buried I will come to you and say, "Who now brings Adam back again to Paradise?"

Then hell spoke back, "Now is the moment for you to listen, Satan. Now you will see the power of the Cross and the great authority of the Crucified. For you, the cross is folly. But the world sees it as a throne, on which, as though seated, Jesus is nailed and hears the thief

cry to him, 'Lord, remember me in your kingdom.' Listen now as he answers, kingly, 'Today, poor beggar, you will reign with me. For with me, you will go in again to Paradise."

At these words, Satan began to wilt, and what he heard he saw: a thief witnessing to Christ crucified. And so, amazed, he struck his breast and said, "Christ did not answer his accusers, and yet he speaks to a thief? To Pilate he never spoke a word; but now he addresses a murderer, saying, "Come, live in pleasure"? What is this? Who has seen words or deeds done by this thief, by means of which he goes again to Paradise?

Again the devil called out, "Receive me, Hell. I turn to you; I submit to your views, I, who did not believe them. I saw the Tree at which you shuddered, made red with blood and water. And I shuddered, not, I

tell you, at the blood, but at the water. For the blood shows Jesus' slaughter, but the water shows his life, for life has gushed from his side. For it was not the first but the second Adam who carried Eve, the mother of all the living, again to Paradise."

Now Hell and Satan cried out together, "Let us lament as we see the Tree which we planted transformed into a holy trunk, beneath which thieves, murderers, tax collectors and harlots will find shelter, and reap sweet fruit from what seemed barren. For they cling to the Cross as the Tree of Life. Pressed against it and swimming, through it they escape, and come again as to a harbor, again to Paradise."

Hell said to Satan, "Swear, tyrant, finally to crucify no one." And Satan replied, "You take an oath to kill no one.

We have had our experience, let us draw back our hand. Let neither of us ever again tyrannize the race of Adam, for it has been sealed by the Cross, it has been given life, like a treasure of a precious pearl in a fragile pot; life, which a thief, well-suited to his trade, took on the Cross. For stealing he was nailed up to die; and having thieved he was called again to Paradise."

O most high and glorious, God of fathers and of youths, your willing outrage has become our honor. For in your Cross, we all may boast. To it we have nailed our hearts, that on it we may hang our instruments and sing to you, the Lord of all, from the songs of Zion. The ship from Tarshish once brought gold to Solomon; but to us your Tree gives back, every day and every moment, wealth beyond price. For it brings us all again to Paradise.



"He Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed!"

"The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He is risen, just as He said. Come and see the place where He lay" (Matt. 28:5-6).

Why has Christianity survived throughout the centuries? It shouldn't have, you know. It should have been stomped out early on. It never should have made it out of the first century. But, it did. Not only did it survive, but it thrived; it grew. What began as a small community of Jewish believers in Jesus of Nazareth grew to encompass the world. By the end of the first century, there were Christian communities found in all parts of the known world.

The spread of Christianity is a phenomenon for which no earthly answer can be found. No one can adequately explain, from an earthly point of view, how Christianity continued to grow throughout the tremendous persecutions it faced from the Jewish religious leaders and the Roman Empire. No one can explain, from an earthly point of view, why Christians would allow themselves and their children to be tortured and executed rather than to renounce their faith in Christ. It makes no sense to the world.

Ah, but it makes sense to us. Christianity has survived and grown throughout the centuries because the man named Jesus was no ordinary Jewish man who merely persuaded people to follow him. He is the Christ, the Son of the Living God, who was crucified on Friday afternoon, but rose from the grave on Sunday morning. Not only did He rise from the dead, but He appeared in His resurrected, glorified Body to His disciples, apostles, and over five hundred brothers (cf. 1 Cor. 15:5-7) to show them that He is the Risen Lord; that He is who He claimed to be.

So, why has Christianity survived and grown throughout the centuries to be the leading world religion right up to the present day, claiming approximately 32% of the world's population? Because Christ rose from the dead and appeared to many, whose eyewitness testimony is recorded for us in Holy Scripture. Many people saw the Risen Christ

and, after seeing Him, they went around telling everyone who would listen, "He is risen! He is risen indeed!"


That's why those early Christians refused to renounce their faith in Christ and willingly went to their deaths—they knew and believed Jesus the Christ rose from the dead! Some of them knew because they themselves saw Him. Others knew because they had the reliable testimony of those who had seen Him. It is faith in the Crucified and Risen Christ that accounts for the survival and growth of Christianity throughout the centuries, right up to the present day. It is the faith that is worked in us by the Holy Spirit when we hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ handed down to us by the apostles of the Lord, who were eyewitnesses of His death and resurrection. We believe, dear friends in Christ, because the Holy Spirit has given us the faith to believe the testimony of the Lord's apostles.

The resurrection of Jesus the Christ is the foundation of true Christian faith. As St. Paul says, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (1 Cor. 15:17). But, Christ did rise from the grave and, because He did, your sins have indeed been taken away. The resurrection of Christ provides the validation that God the Father accepted the perfect sacrifice of His Son on the cross. The resurrection of Christ is the Father's stamp of approval of the Son's atoning work on Calvary. And, because you have that stamp of approval, you can be one hundred percent certain that all of your sins have been completely forgiven and that you, like the Lord Jesus in whom you believe, will also rise from the dead on the Last Day to spend eternity with Him in Paradise. Rejoice in this

awesome Good News and tell everyone you know, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

The Easter Resurrection Homily of

St. John Chrysostom, a.k.a. "Golden Mouth"

This classic Paschal or Easter Sermon on the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is from Saint John Chrysostom, fifth century early church father and one of the greatest preachers of all time. This homily for Holy Pascha exhorts all, even those who have not kept the Lenten fast, to rejoice and enter into the Easter feast of the resurrection.

Let all Pious men and all lovers of God rejoice in the splendor of this feast; let the wise servants blissfully enter into the joy of their Lord; let those who have borne the burden of Lent now receive their pay, and those who have toiled since the first hour, let them now receive their due reward; let any who came after the third hour be grateful to join in the feast, and those who may have come after the sixth, let them not be afraid of being too late, for the Lord is gracious and He receives the last even as the first. He gives rest to him who comes on the eleventh hour as well as to him who has toiled since the first: yes, He has pity on the last and He serves the first; He rewards the one and is generous to the other; he repays the deed and praises the effort.

Come you all: enter into the joy of your Lord. You the first and you the last, receive alike your reward; you rich and you poor, dance together; you sober and you weaklings, celebrate the day; you who have kept the fast and you who have not, rejoice today. The table is richly loaded: enjoy its royal banquet. The calf is a fatted one: let no one go away hungry. All of you enjoy the banquet of faith; all of you receive the riches of his goodness.

Let no one grieve over his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed; let no one weep over his sins, for pardon has shone from the grave; let no one fear death, for the death of our Savior has set us free: He has destroyed it by enduring it, He has despoiled Hades by going down into its kingdom, He has angered it by allowing it to taste of his flesh.

When Isaiah foresaw all this, he cried out: "O Hades, you have been angered by encountering Him in the nether world." Hades is angered because frustrated, it is angered because it has been mocked, it is angered because it has been destroyed, it is angered because it has been reduced to naught, it is angered because it is now captive. It seized a body, and lo! it discovered God; it seized earth, and, behold! it encountered heaven; it seized the visible, and was overcome by the invisible.

O death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory? Christ is risen and life is freed, Christ is risen and the tomb is emptied of the dead: for Christ, being risen from the dead, has become the Leader and Reviver of those who had fallen asleep. To Him be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen.

Message from the Stewardship Committee

No membership dues; no swearing in ceremony; no age requirement; all that is needed is your attendance and participation! So, please, come join us.)

The Peace Stewardship Committee has been reactivated and held its first meeting on Tuesday, March 9. The Committee discussed a number of ways it could serve to remind the members of our congregation about the importance of Christian stewardship, which is highlighted in Article 5.3 of our congregation's Constitution:

Members of this congregation shall conform their entire lives to the authority of the Word of God and to that end shall make diligent use of the means of grace by attending Divine Services frequently, exercise faithful stewardship of their God-given time, talents, and treasures, impart and accept fraternal admonition as the need of such admonition becomes apparent, and be readily available for service in the kingdom of Christ within and beyond this congregation. Membership in organizations whose principles and conduct conflict with the Word of God is prohibited.

One of the first things the Committee would like to accomplish is to make certain that all members of Peace know our current service opportunities. Perhaps there are some of you who would like to help but do not know what needs to be done. The kinds of service within the congregation listed below is not required of Christians, but is encouraged and can be a bigger blessing to the person doing the serving than to the recipients.

Following is an extensive, but not exhaustive, list (in alphabetical order) of the kinds of activities that happen regularly and at special times of year in our congregation. We are blessed with many dedicated members who work to accomplish most of what is listed here. More help from anyone in the congregation would be greatly appreciated. There are no age limitations for volunteers. Young and old are welcome. While it is true that some of these duties require special talents or skills, many of them only require the desire to spend time with your brothers and sisters and to serve the Peace community and/or the community at large. Consider this as nothing more than an invitation to serve when and where you are willing and able. We simply want to make all our members aware of the opportunities which exist in our congregation to put their God-given time and talents to use.

Each section of opportunities includes a contact person. See him or her if you would like to volunteer. Thanks for your consideration.

Altar Guild Contact: Carol Zeile

A subcommittee of the Ladies' Guild, the Altar Guild is charged with all duties related to preparing the Altar area and the Communion for each Service. Serving on the Altar Guild is a wonderful privilege and can uniquely enhance the Divine Service for those who want to be involved. New volunteers to the Altar Guild would be fully trained and could choose to serve with an experienced woman, or on their own. Generally, Altar Guild duty is assigned on a monthly basis, but someone who could help out now and then would also be most appreciated.

Call to Order: President Coaline Luplow gave the call to order at 7:05 p.m. Pastor Messer offered the opening prayer. Those attending were Coaline Luplow, Carol Zeile, Lois Ramsey, Sharyn Greening, Charlotte Dargie, Marlene Miller, Mary Jakolat, and Pastor Messer. Vern Jakolat attended part of the meeting. The devotion, presented by Coaline, was "Jesus Through Moses" the Portals of Prayer reading for the day. Mites were collected.

Secretary Report: The Secretary Report was approved as presented.

Treasurer Report: Fund Balances: Checking, \$317.20; Savings, \$2,356.56.

Committee Reports:

- Altar: Carol Zeile. Carol continued with readings from the LCMS Altar Guild Manual addressing Holy Week, the most dramatic and significant time of the Church Year. The focus is triumph to tragedy. The paraments colors for the week are scarlet, signifying royalty and passion. The alternate color is violet. The Palm Sunday Service begins with a procession of palms. On Maundy Thursday, the altar is stripped at the end of the Divine Service in remembrance of Christ's humiliation at the hands of the Roman soldiers. The paraments change to Black for Good Friday. Easter is the high point of the Church Year. The paraments color is white; gold is the alternate color. The sanctuary is decorated with flowers and the Christ Candle is replaced with the Paschal Candle. An ancient custom is the Vigil of Easter, on Holy Saturday night. It is a simple Service with Scripture readings and a candle-light procession. The main service is on Easter Sunday. Consensus is to incorporate gold paper and white bows for the Easter lily plants. Carol will talk with Jon Penzien.
- **Banner**: Gretchen Harrison. The third banner book has been located and has been placed in the church office. The invoice for the standard banners for the church year is \$562.66. Some donations were received for this project, and Ladies Guild will pay the difference of \$262.66.
- **Sunshine**: Marlene Miller. Many people indicated they would like to receive on-line greeting cards from Ladies Guild. Some e-cards were sent in February.
- **Kitchen:** Coaline Luplow and Lois Ramsey. The RADA Cutlery was on display during the February 21 coffee hour; \$7.75 was received for sales of product on hand. Several ladies placed orders from the catalogue.
- Library: Coaline Luplow. No new books have been added to the library
- **Special Events:** Coaline Luplow and Lois Ramsey. Cake will be served during fellowship hour on March 7 in recognition of Kylie Stahl's baptism.
- Charitable Donations: Dorothy Trgina. A box for LWR donations has been placed in the fellowship hall.

Comments by Pastor: Pastor explained the ancient service of Easter Vigil, which will be added at Peace this year. Easter Vigil is a time of celebration, to celebrate that our Lord is passing from death to life. Following custom, and in keeping with the celebratory spirit, a short reception including a champagne toast and light hors d'oeuvres is held after the Vigil.
