Summary Minutes from Church Council Meeting, December 5, 2006

Minutes from the November 8, 2006 meeting were accepted as presented.

Pastor's Report:

- Members of the Youth Confirmation class are doing an intensive study of their confirmation verses and will present them to the congregation.
- Together in the Word still studying John.
- Adult Bible Class Revelation
- Table Talk none in December
- No adult information class at this time.
- Greek class will begin in the new year.
- First Advent service Wednesday, Dec. 6.

Treasurer's Report:

- Church Extension Fund CD renewed at 5.5 percent.
- Youth Group has not received \$2500 yet this year.
- Pastor asked if any members of Council have a recommendation for a chair of a stewardship committee. Pastor and Vern will get together to choose a stewardship committee.

Board of Elders Report:

- The elders are still working on locating inactive members.
- They are meeting the second Sunday of the month. Their next meeting is Dec. 10.

Board of Trustees Report:

- Bill Brostrom called Bill Koutz at the hospital concerning their possible use of our parking lot. He has not heard anything yet. The only changes
 that Bill Brostrom suggested were that the hospital have a policy for 1 million dollars of insurance and that they take care of snow removal during
 the time they are using our parking lot.
- Bill also called Gratiot Family Practice to discuss their interest in purchasing our property. They are more interested in buying a piece of our land than in the building. Bill told them that they probably could use the building. They will get back to Bill by the first of the year.
- Board of Trustees will need to meet before the January Council Meeting (January 9).

Board of Christian Education Report:

- Sunday School is going well. The practices for Christmas program are going well. Dress rehearsal will be this Sunday. Program is Sunday, December 17 at 4:00 p.m.
- We have received information for VBS for next year and will be ordering a sample kit soon.

S.A.L.T. Report:

- The Advent Tea was very successful.
- There is an Adopt a Family Tree in the Fellowship Hall. Congregation members are asked to take a tag off of the tree and purchase gifts for our adopted family.

Divine Service Planning

At the Good Shepherd Institute held at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne this past November, Dr. Arthur A. Just Jr. led a workshop entitled "Planning Services from LSB Resources." During that workshop, he provided us with many wonderful ideas about how to plan Services using our new LSB hymnals, one of which was to think "seasonally" when choosing which settings of the Divine Service to use. Rather than choosing different settings at random week by week, he suggested that we choose a specific setting for each time of the Church Year. I think this is a fantastic idea and we have already begun to implement this practice here at Peace. By using the same settings of the Divine Service throughout the different times in the Church Year, we will hopefully come to appreciate each setting's unique characteristics more and, over time, will grow to associate them with the different seasons of the Church Year. With all of that said, below is the schedule of Divine Service settings we will use here at Peace according to the Church Year:

Time of Christmas (Advent/Christmas/Epiphany)

Divine Service 3

Time of Easter (Lent/Holy Week/Easter)

Divine Service 1

Time of Pentecost Divine Service 2 (spring and fall)

Divine Service 4 (summer)

Reformation Day (and possibly other Feasts and Festivals)

Divine Service 5

By following the above schedule, we will accomplish a couple of things: We will use all of the settings of the Divine Service found in LSB and we will use the two settings we are most familiar with (DS 1 and 3) during the Festival Half of the Church Year (Times of Christmas and Easter). It is my sincere hope and prayer that this "seasonal" schedule will be a blessing to us and will lead us to better appreciate the wonderful variety of Services we have available to us in our new hymnal.

<u>Introduction of New Hymns</u>: Speaking of planning Services, one of the challenges that automatically comes with the implementation of a new hymnal is the introduction of new hymns to the congregation. Let me just say that, as your pastor, I fully recognize that this challenge exists and will work with our musicians to plan the introduction of new hymns in a careful and appropriate manner. I bring this to your attention because I know that we have already experienced a couple "bumps in the road" along the way and, while I can't promise that we will not experience some "bumps" in the future, I can promise that we will do our best to see to it that they are few and far between from this point on.

A few of the ways in which we will accomplish this is 1) by employing our wonderful adult choir often in the months to come to aid us in the learning of new hymns, especially the more difficult ones; 2) by scheduling the same new hymn for a few consecutive weeks; 3) by alerting you to the fact that a hymn is new in the bulletin so that you can be prepared for it; 4) by playing through the new hymns as pre-Service music.

You can also assist in this process by checking the bulletin before the Service to see if there are any new hymns being used that day and, if there are, by looking at them and by listening to the pre-Service music when they are being played.

One of the greatest blessings of our new LSB hymnal is that it contains many new and absolutely beautiful new hymns which will, I firmly believe, become favorites within our congregation over time. Please bear with us as we undertake the challenge of introducing them. Thank you!

"IT'S ALL GREEK TO ME"

As promised, I will be offering a class for all who are interested in learning Elementary Biblical Greek this year. This class will be designed to introduce you to the basics of Biblical Greek grammar, the most frequently used vocabulary, and will provide you with the ability to use the tools necessary to translate, read, study, and learn the New Testament in its original language. No experience in learning foreign languages is necessary to participate in this class and the class will truly be taught at an elementary level so you need not fear it being too difficult. In order to aid the learning process, there will be quizzes and tests along the way, but they will be for your benefit only. They will not be turned in and graded, etc.

For those who are interested in participating in this class, we will have an **informational meeting** on **Sunday**, **January 21 at 12:00**, following Adult Bible Study. At that time, we will determine, based upon the availability of those who will be participating in the class, on what day and at what time the class will be held.

Speaking from experience, I can tell you that it is a great joy to be able to read, study, and learn the New Testament in its original language. If you want to experience that joy, this is the class for you! If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

MY POSITION ON THE USE OF INDIVIDUAL CUPS DURING THE HOLY SUPPER

Recently, a member of our congregation approached me and said, "I've heard people say that you don't like the individual cups. Is that true?" I replied, "Yes, that is true." Then, this member asked the appropriate question, "Why?" And, after explaining to this member the reasons why I don't like the individual cups, this member warmed this pastor's heart by saying, "Now that you've explained that to me, I will take the common cup from now on."

This conversation alerted me to the possibility that there may be more of you out there who have heard that I don't like the individual cups and are wondering why. For this reason, I will be making available to everyone a copy of a paper I wrote during seminary regarding this issue. Copies of this paper, which is titled, "The Common Cup or Individual Cups: Does it Matter?" will be placed on the table in the Fellowship Hall and you can pick one up as you wish. I will also post a copy of the paper on our website.

A great many of you are already well aware of my position on the use of individual cups as we have discussed this many times during Bible Studies and at meetings. I made a vow long ago that I would be open and honest regarding issues like this should the Lord ever call me to serve as a pastor. Of course, there is always risk involved with being open and honest. The risk, in this case, is that by revealing my dislike of the individual cups, you might conclude that I look down on you, or think less of you, for using them. Let me assure you that nothing could be further from the truth. My goal in revealing this to you is not to make you feel guilty for receiving the individual cups, but to educate you as to why I believe, based on the evidence I provide in my paper, that the common cup is preferred. My hope is that you will read my paper and study the issue, for I firmly believe that you will look at this issue in a different light if you do. And, if you don't want to read the paper for whatever reason, you can always speak with me personally about this issue anytime—my door is always open.

Finally, I would be less than completely honest if I failed to mention that it is, indeed, my sincere hope and prayer that putting this issue on the table like this will eventually lead to fruitful discussion within our congregation over whether or not we should continue this practice. I would love to see the day when this practice was eliminated in our congregation and in our Synod. And, while I know that I'll almost assuredly never see the day that the latter comes to fruition, I also know that it is possible at the congregational level as many congregations have eliminated the practice or are in the process of doing so. Maybe, just maybe, we will join them someday.
