The Holiest Week of the Year

Next week, we will enter the most important week in the Church Year. Holy Week is so named because, well, it is the holiest week of the year. Why? Because, during this week, we commemorate the Passion of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, by which He won salvation for us through His holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death. This is the week when we most fully meditate upon the mysterious and glorious work our Lord did in our place and on our behalf. This is the week when the reason for our celebration at Christmas finds its fulfillment, for the Baby born in Bethlehem came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and became man precisely to do what He does during Holy Week—to suffer and die on the cross to save us, and to rise on the third day to open for us the way to eternal life.

The whole world should stop everything during this week and take time to meditate upon its holy events. But, the whole world won't do that. This will just be another week for the world. Businesses will not close; sports events will not be put on hold; the television will not cease broadcasting its shows, and so on. The world will march through this week without giving its holy nature a second thought.

This is to be expected, of course. The world wants nothing to do with Christ and His salvation. There is nothing holy about this week in the eyes of the unbelieving, dead, and dying world.

But, who would expect Christians to allow this week to come and go without embracing its holy nature? Indeed, how could Christians possibly let this week just pass them by? It seems unthinkable, and yet, this is exactly what many Christians do. They pay the holiest week of the year

little attention, if any—and that is very, very sad.

I pray fervently that such will not be the case with the saints here at Peace. Do not let this week just pass you by, dear friends. You are Christians, and Holy Week is all about what your Lord and Savior did for you, so that you may be receive the blessings which belong to Christians.

In order to give all of the saints here at Peace an opportunity to embrace this holiest of weeks, we are expanding our Holy Week Services this year. Every day of Holy Week (Monday through Saturday) will begin with the praying of Matins at 7:00 a.m. On Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, and Holy Wednesday, Divine Service (spoken) will be held at both Noon and 7:00 p.m. We'll follow the same schedule we've followed in the past for Holy (Maundy) Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, but we are adding an Easter Sunrise Service at 7:00 a.m. to our regularly scheduled Festival of the Resurrection of Our Lord at 9:30 a.m. on Easter Sunday (breakfast served between Services). More information about our Holy Week schedule can be found on the next page.

I sincerely hope and pray that these additional opportunities to be in the Holy House of the Lord during the holiest week of the year will afford all of you the chance to allow Holy Week to have its way with you, bringing you ever

closer to your Lord, that you may come to the celebration of the Paschal Feast on Easter in all sincerity and truth.

Divine Service (spoken liturgy) will be held at both Noon and 7:00 p.m. (same Service) to allow everyone the opportunity to attend and receive the blessings of Word and Sacrament.

The focus on this Most Holy Day is on the Blessed Sacrament of our Lord's Body and Blood, which He instituted on the night when He was betrayed. The Divine Service at 7:00 p.m. will be different from the spoken Divine Service at Noon, and will include the "Christian Questions with Their Answers," written by Dr. Luther for those who intend to go to the Sacrament, and will conclude with the Stripping of the Altar while Psalm 22 is being read.





Update from the Treasurer

Through January 31, 2009, our offering total was \$7659.01 and our expenses \$10,902.08. This compares to an offering of \$7,869.31 and expenses of \$9437.26 through January 31, 2008. I did not transfer any funds from savings during January 2009.

There are a few reasons for the higher expenses in 2009 as compared to 2008. The snow removal bill which was paid in January 2009 was \$648, \$308 more than the bill in the same month of 2008. Another expense item that almost doubled in January 2009 over January 2008 was utilities. We paid \$737 in 2008 for all utilities and \$1500 in 2009. The main reason for the 2009 increase is that we were billed twice in January by Consumers Energy. The December 2008 automatic withdrawal did not happen until January 2009.
