FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MESSER

"Defining Lutheranism"

On June 23, I was privileged to attend the Conference on the Augsburg Confession at Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Marion, Ohio. As I sat in the pew of that beautiful old church for the opening Divine Service, I held in my hands a Lutheran Worship hymnal which once graced a pew rack here at Peace (Gethsemane is the congregation to which we donated our old TLH and LW hymnals). It was really neat to see "Peace Lutheran Church" engraved on the covers of many of those hymnals. What a blessing it is to know that we were able to provide our brothers and sisters in Christ at Gethsemane with hymnals to use during Divine Service. We are truly blessed to be a blessing!

The Conference was outstanding. The keynote speaker was Dr. Lawrence R. Rast, Jr., who is currently serving as the Academic Dean and as Professor of Historical Theology at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne. Dr. Rast was one of my favorite profs at the seminary. I was fortunate to have four classes with him and learned much from him. Listening to him speak on Article IV of the Augsburg Confession, which presents the chief article of the Christian faith—justification by grace through faith in Christ—was like being home.

In addition to Dr. Rast's fine presentation, we were privileged to attend three breakout

sessions focusing on other articles of the Augsburg Confession, all of which were outstanding.

During the course of the breakout session on Article V of the Augsburg Confession (On the Office of the Holy Ministry), Rev. Lance O'Donnell shared with us what I believe to be the best definition of Lutheranism I have ever heard. He defined Lutheranism as "An absolute, unrelenting focus on forgiveness and the means through which Christ promises it."

Pastor O'Donnell informed us that he arrived at this definition after being asked by others repeatedly over the years what Lutheranism is all about. He serves in an area that is heavily populated by Methodists, and the congregation he serves is the only Lutheran congregation for miles. Thus, people often ask him what it means to be a Lutheran. He humbly admitted that he had "blown it" many times over the years when trying to respond to his inquirers. He either said too much or too little. But now, when he is asked, he responds with the definition above.

What an awesome definition of Lutheranism! It truly is "An absolute, unrelenting focus on forgiveness and the means through which Christ promises it." Our focus on forgiveness and the means through which Christ promises it stands at the center of all we say and do as Lutherans. It always has!

This was the very reason for the Reformation of the Holy Christian Church in the 16th century. Luther was led by the Holy Spirit to discover the truth in Scripture. The Church in his day had become corrupt and had lost sight of the truth. It taught that forgiveness was merited (earned) by

human beings in a variety of ways—the purchase of indulgences, confession of all sins followed by making satisfaction through holy works, going on pilgrimages to holy sites, etc. But, Luther discovered the truth, that forgiveness is not something we merit or earn, but has been merited and earned for all of us by the perfect life and death of Jesus Christ.

What amazing, beautiful Good News this is for us sinners! It means that Christ won forgiveness for *all* our sins—yes, even those really bad sins that still burden you. It means that we need not worry about whether or not we have been good enough,

for Christ has been good enough for us all. It means that there are no "ifs" attached to our forgiveness. Christ has taken away all the "ifs" by His Holy and Precious Blood shed on the cross. We are forgiven! It is a guarantee!

We Lutherans need to maintain an absolute, unrelenting focus on the forgiveness Christ won for all people on the cross. We also need to maintain an absolute, unrelenting focus on the means through which Christ promises that forgiveness to us. These two go hand in hand and make Rev. O'Donnell's definition of Lutheranism complete. You see, while Christ has won forgiveness for all people of all time, it is only through the means of grace He has established—His Holy Word and Sacraments—that the forgiveness He won is delivered to sinners. Thus, an absolute, unrelenting focus on forgiveness would be meaningless without focusing on the means by which that forgiveness is applied to us. Therefore, the means of grace Christ has established must remain at the heart and center of all that we Lutherans say and do.

This is just as true in our day and age as it was for our Lutheran forefathers in the 16th century. In fact, the challenges we face today are even more severe than what they faced back then. Today, it is not only the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches which teach that human beings must earn the forgiveness Christ won for all people. This false teaching is taught by nearly all Protestant Churches as well. In one way or another, nearly all of Christendom has adopted the false belief that sinners must do something to "get right with God" and merit forgiveness.

But, we Lutherans know differently. We know the truth. We know that we have no ability within ourselves to "get right with God," but Christ has done all things necessary to make us "right with God." We know that because the Holy Spirit has worked through the Holy Word and Sacraments to bring us to faith. And, through faith in Christ—not through good works, not through holy living, not through indulgences, not through pilgrimages, not through a "personal decision," not through Church membership, not through a special anointing, and so on—we ARE forgiven and we ARE declared righteous in God's sight! Period! No ifs, ands, or buts!

"An absolute, unrelenting focus on forgiveness and the means through which Christ promises it." That's what Lutheranism is all about, because that's what Christianity is all about. May it be what we are all about here at Peace always! Your servant in Christ,

Synopsis of June 5, 2007 Church Council Minutes

Call To Order & Opening Prayer:

• President Jakolat called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Pastor Messer conducted the opening prayer. The following members were present: Vern Jakolat, Megan Brown, Carol Zeile, Dave Zeile, Bill Brostrom, Sharyn Greening. Members absent: Miguel Ortiz, Coaline Luplow, Larry Elliott, Dick Kohler. Non-voting members present: Pastor Messer

Approval of Agenda:

The following items were added to the agenda: Under New Business, the Council is to discuss Officer Vacancies

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes:

• Motion made by Councilmember Greening, supported by Treasurer Zeile to approve the minutes from the meeting of May 1, 2007 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Reports:

• The following reports were presented and received into record: Pastor, Treasurer, Board of Elders, Board of Trustees, Board of Christian Education, Board of Evangelism, Board of Stewardship, Peace Lutheran Ladies Guild, Constitution & Bylaws, Budget & Finance.

Old Business:

Procedures and Control Regarding Offering Money - Motion made by Councilmember Greening, supported by Treasurer Zeile, in
the absence of the Financial Secretary, the Elder on duty after each Service shall ask two (2) members of the Board of Elders or the
Council (with the exception of the Treasurer and the Pastor) to count, deposit, and perform any corresponding record keeping of
offering money. Motion carried unanimously.

New Business:

- Function of Budget & Finance Committee The Council was reminded that this is an advisory committee and the Council has the final authority to make decisions.
- Officer Vacancies: Vice President and Chair of Board of Evangelism The position of Vice President will be open due to Miguel Ortiz moving out of state. President Jakolat, Pastor Messer and the Chair of the Board of Elders will meet to discuss candidate for this vacancy. The Council also discussed the status of the Chair position of the Board of Evangelism. Larry and Andrea Elliott have stepped down from their duties as co-chairs. The possibility remains that Larry and Andrea can remain co-chairs and designate a member of the Board to serve on their behalf.

General Comments:

- Mailing Newsletters The Council discussed the cost involved with mailing newsletters that are not picked up by members. The practice will be reviewed in order to save money.
- Greening Sisters Donation The four sisters of Jon Greening have generously donated \$2,000 for a special purchase for the congregation.
- Wallpaper Behind Altar Pastor Messer inquired about the wallpaper behind the altar and would like to talk with founding members to determine if it can be removed or updated.
- Use of Fellowship Hall for Elections Secretary Brown informed the Council that a notice was received from the City of Alma that the Fellowship Hall would not be needed for the Primary Election scheduled for August 7.

Adjournment & Closing Prayer:

• Motion made by Councilmember Brostrom, supported by Councilmember Greening to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 9:02pm. Pastor Messer conducted the closing prayer.
