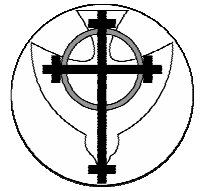

From the Desk of Pastor Messer

“Having a heart for the lost and growing the Church”

Greetings in the Name of our Crucified and Risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

I receive emails all the time from a variety of Christian organizations advertising the latest and greatest gimmicks and gadgets they have invented in order to “pack the pews.” If I will just follow their advice and adopt their principles and programs, I am assured that my ministry will be blessed and the congregation I serve will grow.

I usually just delete these kinds of emails, but every once in a while, I’ll open one and read what is being advanced by these so-called “church growth experts.” But, it never fails that, by the third or fourth paragraph, I am reminded of why I usually just delete these emails without reading them, for what they promote is not genuine church growth, but principles and programs assured to make your church more appealing to the world in order to increase the size of your membership roster.

Now, maybe I am missing something, but I have read the entire Bible a number of times (really, I have), and I have yet to come across the passage in which God urges His children to become more worldly in order to increase the size of His kingdom. There simply is no, “Thus saith the Lord: Get with the program, people! Find out what unbelievers like and give it to them so that My Church can grow!” Anyone who has even skimmed through Holy Scripture would realize how absurd such a commandment would be coming from our Lord.

And yet, this is exactly what today’s “church growth experts” and “church consultants” promote. They tell us that we need to develop “a church for people who don’t like church.” How can we develop such a “church”?

Well, that’s easy. We simply give people who don’t like church what they want. And, hey, we do not even have to go and find out what it is that people want, because these “gurus” have already done that work for us. They have completed demographics studies and conducted numerous surveys and already know what people want in a church. All we have to do is follow their advice and – voilá! – instant church growth will occur.

Now, just take a moment to ponder this. What they are advocating is that the Christian Church determine what non-Churchgoers, and even non-Christians, desire, and then change in order to fulfill those desires. What ends up happening in this insane scenario is that non-Churchgoers, and even non-Christians, end up setting the agenda for what the Church does, how it worships, what programs it employs, etc. It is nothing short of amazing that people who call themselves Christians promote this utter nonsense. It is even more amazing that so many people buy into this nonsense and see the ever-changing, “new and improved,” more appealing “Christian” Church as a blessing.

Of course, when you speak out against these things, as I am here, you are accused of “not having a heart for the lost,” or of not being willing “to do whatever it takes to win souls for the Lord.” So be it! For if “having a heart for the lost” and “doing whatever it takes to win souls for the Lord” means selling out to the world, I want nothing to do with it. And, guess what. Neither does the Lord!

Our Lord does not measure our success based on the number of people we have in the pews on Sunday. He’s not into numbers – at least, not in that way. He’s

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into faithfulness. He always has been and always will be. He does not change. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. And, He has established His Church, by means of His own Holy Blood, to be a sanctuary from the world and its ways, and the devil and his wiles. And, while He does desire that His Church “have a heart for the lost,” He does not ask His Church to “do whatever it takes to win souls.” He has already done everything it takes to win souls by living the perfect life in our stead and by dying on the cross for our sins. Thus, He gives His Church the mission of seeking and saving the lost not by giving the lost what they desire, but by delivering unto the lost what they need – the Law to convict them of their sinfulness and the Gospel to point them to their only hope for salvation, Jesus Christ.

So it is that Christians who truly “have a heart for the lost” will never attempt to come up with new fads, gimmicks, and gadgets which have the purpose of making the Church more appealing to the lost. Instead, they will be about the business of “making disciples.” How? By “baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit” and “by teaching them to observe all that the Lord has commanded” (cf. Matt. 28:19-20). Hmmm . . . it sounds to me like the Lord would have the Church convert the lost, not the lost convert the Church. For that reason, I think I’ll just continue to hit the delete button when those emails appear in my inbox.

Call To Order & Opening Prayer - President Brown called the meeting to order at 11:10am with 33 members present. Pastor Messer conducted the opening prayer.

Approval of Agenda – Motion made by Vice President Ortiz, supported by Jon Penzien to approve the agenda with amendments to remove the Constitution & Bylaws report and to add Administrative Assistant Position as a business item. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes – January 27, 2008 & March 30, 2008 – Motion made by Dave Zeile, supported by Financial Secretary Miller to approve the previous minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Report(s)

Pastor – No report.

Treasurer – Treasurer Zeile presented the attached report. It was received into record.

Financial Secretary – Financial Secretary Miller informed the Assembly that the first quarter financial statements had been distributed.

Boards

Board of Elders – Chairman Elliott informed the Assembly that districts had been restructured.

Board of Trustees – Chairman Sager informed the Assembly that Spring Clean-Up Day is scheduled for May 17 and members were encouraged to sign up for cleaning.

Board of Christian Education – Chairperson Greening informed the Assembly that VBS will be June 16-20 with a theme of Friendship Trek.

Board of Evangelism – Chairperson Elliott informed the Assembly that a camping weekend has been schedule for August 15-17.

Board of Stewardship – Pastor Messer shared information regarding the Board of Stewardship with the Assembly.

Organization and Committee Reports

Peace Lutheran Ladies Guild – No report.

Peace Youth Group – Jon Penzien thanked the members for their support and informed the group that a craft bazaar was scheduled for May 3 as a fundraiser.

Budget & Finance – No report.

Business

Removal of Members by Self-Exclusion – Motion made by Financial Secretary Miller, supported by Coaline Luplow to approve the removal of members by self-exclusion. Motion carried unanimously.

**(At this time, one member left the meeting, leaving 32 members present.)

Sanctuary Renovation Proposal – Bill Brostrom presented an action plan for the project and it was discussed by the Assembly. Motion made by Vice President Ortiz, supported by Sharyn Greening to accept the proposal. Motion did not carry. Motion made by Gretchen Harrison, supported by Jon Penzien to authorize the Church Council to spend no more than \$5300 to renovate the altar area (phase one) including the railing, steps, pulpit and wiring. Following discussion, the motion carried by a vote of 28-4.

**(At this time, one member left the meeting, leaving 31 members present.)

Administrative Assistant Position – Pastor Messer informed the Assembly that the proposal needed to be revised due to compliance issues with the law. Pastor Messer presented the Assembly with two options:

- Previously, the Assembly approved \$4800 for the position. In order to be in compliance with the law, the new cost would be \$8300.
- It could be asked of the individual in the position that they donate back \$3100 leaving the cost to \$5200.

**(At this time, three members left the meeting, leaving 28 members present.)

Motion made by Don Reithel, supported by Vice President Ortiz to proceed with the second option with Ken & Phyllis Hill providing up to \$500 to cover the difference in cost. Following a discussion, the motion carried by a vote of 27-1.

Adjournment & Closing Prayer – Motion made by Lauren Penzien, supported by Gretchen Harrison to adjourn at 12:48pm. Motion carried unanimously. Pastor Messer conducted the Benediction.

Call To Order & Opening Prayer – The meeting was called to order by Financial Secretary Miller at 7:06pm. Pastor Messer conducted the opening prayer. The following members were present: Megan Brown, Sharyn Greening, Gary Miller, Carol Zeile, Gretchen Harrison, James Sager, Larry Elliott (7:20pm) and Chris Brown (7:55pm). Pastor Messer was also present.

Approval of Agenda – Motion made by Councilmember Greening, supported by Treasurer Zeile to approve the agenda with the addition of one business item: Church Office Chair. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Consent Agenda – Treasurer Zeile requested to have the Board of Trustees report removed from the consent agenda for additional discussion. Pastor Messer also added to his report that the Elders will lead the services on June 15 and 22 as he will be out of town. Motion made by Councilmember Greening, supported by Treasurer Zeile to approve the consent agenda with changes. Motion carried unanimously.

Roof Estimates – Pastor informed the Council that there were concerns from a member about the condition of the roof and the member offered to get estimates.

Church Office Chair – Pastor Messer informed the Council that a new chair is needed for the office for Mary to use while working, as she was currently using her own from home. Councilmember Greening offered an extra chair she was not currently using.

General Comment

Councilmember Greening reminded the Council that VBS is June 16-20. She also noted that the phone in the kitchen does not work and that some of the cupboard doors are not staying closed.

Adjournment & Closing Prayer – Motion made by Financial Secretary Gary Miller, supported by Secretary Brown to adjourn at 8:46pm. Motion carried unanimously. Pastor Messer conducted the Benediction.

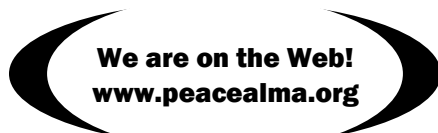
