"For You! - A Higher Things Youth Conference"

I have been to many youth conferences and retreats in my day, but none of them even comes close to comparing to the recent Higher Things "For You" Conference I attended in Minneapolis with Jon Penzien, Anna Brostrom, and five of our youth (Sarah and Samantha Messer, Lauren and Melanie Penzien, and Rebekah Rodriguez).

Having been a huge fan of Higher Things since the organization began in 2001, my expectations were very high. They were met, and then some!

It is hard to say what impressed me the most, simply because I was thoroughly impressed with every aspect of the conference. But, if I had to choose, it was the worship services. They were outstanding, simply Divine! No praise bands singing contemporary Christian rock songs. No motivational pep-talks. No gimmicks to incite emotions. Just straight liturgy and hymnody from the LSB hymnal and faithful, Law and Gospel preaching from every pastor who preached. All nine of the services (2 Divine Services, 2 Matins, 2 Vespers, and 3 Evening Prayer) were beautifully done and truly awe-inspiring. And, here's the really neat part-the kids loved it!

Each night, our group would gather together to discuss the events of the day. It was wonderful to hear our youth talk about how much they appreciated the worship services. They were truly impressed, especially with the beautiful Evening Prayer services each night, which included the burning of incense upon the altar. They all expressed how they thought that was "awesome!" They thought all of the worship services were awesome, but "that incense thing was very cool!"

The catechesis at the conference was equally impressive. Rev. Todd Wilken and Rev. Bill Cwirla led the plenary sessions (daily group sessions which everyone attended) and did a wonderful job. What impressed me the most was that their catechesis (teaching) was not "dumbed down" for the youth. That's not to say that they didn't recognize their audience and teach the youth in a way that they could understand. They did. They employed appropriate anecdotal materials and relevant current events to which the youth could relate, but the catechesis was both solid and thorough.

The same can be said for all of the In-Depth and Breakaway Sectionals. The In-Depth Sectionals were three-session workshops. There were ten to choose from and you chose one and attended it each day during the conference. The Breakaway Sectionals were single workshops. There were five Breakaway Sectionals to attend during the conference and ten or more to choose from each time. All of the In-Depth and Breakaway Sectionals attended by the members in our group were excellent. Some were better than others, but they were all both solid and thorough.

In addition to the beautiful worship and

solid catechesis at the conference, there were also opportunities to simply have fun. We went to a comedy show, karaoke club, minor league baseball game, and, of course, the Mall of America.

The slogan for Higher Things is "Dare to be Lutheran!" The governing principle for their conferences is, "We worship when we worship, work when we work, and play when we play." Having attended this conference, I can honestly say that Higher Things truly practices what it preaches. I could not have been more impressed, and I cannot wait until next year! I hope and pray that more of our youth will attend!

The Plenary sessions were sessions that everyone attended together. These were my personal favorite out of the sessions. Of course, somewhere in there you went to lunch and dinner, too.

Then, we either had free time or some fun activity that they had scheduled for us. And then, at the end of the day, we went to Evening Prayer. These Services were my favorite. They were just as pretty as Divine Service. They burned incense upon the altar and everyone could smell it within a few minutes of them lighting it. It was very cool!

I learned a lot from this experience. The worship was beautiful and all of the sessions taught me something about my Lutheran faith and I thought that was really cool. I am very excited to go back next year and hope that more people will come. If you would ask me my opinion about going, I would strongly recommend it!

SUMMARY OF 2007 RELAY FOR LIFE





Congratulations everyone on a super effort in this year's Gratiot county Relay for Life.

Earlier this week, our campaign chairperson, Jayne Norris, announced that the total dollars

raised to date was, drum roll please, \$103,583.50. This is truly an astounding accomplishment, especially in view of our present economy; Gratiot County has not raised more than \$100, 000.00 in quite a few years.

In addition, the Peace Lutheran Church team raised a total of \$4,730.00, which exceeded last year's total by almost \$500.00. Our Chicken Barbecue was quite successful, we sold over 200 dinners and, after expenses, made over \$1,000.00. With all fund-raising efforts, we were also able to obtain the full grant allotted by Thrivent Financial for Lutherans of \$1,440.00 which is included in the total referenced above.

Many of you expressed appreciation in being a partner in this worthwhile effort and indicated interest to participate again next year, which by the way, will be held at Alma High School starting Friday, August 8 thru Saturday August 9, 2008.
