From the Desk of Pastor Messer "Fifty Years of God's Grace"

As I write this, we are less than two weeks away from celebrating our congregation's Fiftieth Anniversary, which is an enormous blessing from our Lord. The custom logo we had designed, which has graced the cover of our newsletter the last

few months, includes the phrase, "Fifty Years of God's Grace." That, dear friends, is exactly what we'll be celebrating on Sunday, November 11, and on other important dates in the coming year, namely that our congregation was formed, and has been sustained these fifty years, solely by the grace of God. This is the very reason our God gathers His children together around His Holy Word and Sacraments—to dish out His grace (undeserved favor) upon sinners in need. This is why we rightly call His Holy Word and Sacraments the "means of grace," for it is through these means, as through instruments, that our Lord creates and sustains saving faith in us. These "means of grace" are really the only reason for any Christian congregation to exist, and we give heartfelt thanks to God for keeping His Holy Word and Sacraments central to all that we think, say, and do as His congregation in Alma.

I have been thoroughly enjoying going through the archives of our congregation these past few months in preparation for our celebration. Reading letters from past pastors and newspaper articles about past events and looking at old pictures has instilled in me a sense of God's gracious presence among the saints He's served over the years, right up to the present day. It is that gracious presence of our God that has been the one constant throughout our congregation's history, and that connects all the saints who have been served here, both past and present, in an intimate fellowship that lasts beyond earthly years and endures eternally.

A special blessing resides in the fact that we will hold our Anniversary Service and Banquet on November 11, which is fifty years to the day from the very first Divine Service held by Peace. It is also this date that is the reason our congregation was named "Peace," for our predecessors chose that name in recognition of Armistice Day (now called Veterans Day). It's a great name for a Christian congregation, for we gather together to receive Jesus Christ, our Lord, who is "the peace that passes all understanding."

I'm very much looking forward to our celebration and hope that many of you will be there to celebrate with us. This is a significant event in the life of our congregation, for which we give all glory, honor, and praise to our Triune God!

A Letter from Pastor Rhoades at the Onset of Peace's Formation

(Rev. Cecil L. Rhoades was Peace's first pastor)

15 October 1962

"Grace be to you and peace from God the Father, and from our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for our sins, that He might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father; to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen." (Galatians 1:3-5)

As the pastor of a new Lutheran congregation in Alma-St. Louis, I am overjoyed to be able to inform you of our progress, for which the entire credit is due to our loving Triune God, the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. While we may plow and plant, only He may grant an increase.

For some time the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod has contemplated the founding of a congregation in Alma. At the same time it was the conviction of our district's officials that a thorough investigation should take place before committing ourselves to the actual cultivation of the area. For this purpose the writer was called, upon his graduation from our seminary in Springfield, Illinois. In the course of his labors, in which he had splendid co-operation from our congregations in Frankenmuth, Wheeler, and Mt. Pleasant, and from the people of this community, he was able to confirm that the area is indeed a fertile field.

In addition to an impressive number of highly interested persons of Lutheran conviction, our investigation has discovered well over 200 others who are in the category of good prospects, and many unchurched persons. On the basis of these findings our church has determined to establish a congregation in Alma.

Today much of the plowing has taken place. It remains for us to decide what we are to plant and the best means of planting. But has not the Word of God already established for us what we are to plant? It tells us to preach the Gospel (Christ crucified) to every creature. Then it remains for us to set up the machinery.

Our first service is scheduled for November 11 in the Bank of Alma, at 311 Woodworth Street; and we are grateful indeed for the free use of their facilities, as well as their gracious permission to store our church furniture on their premises. We also owe thanks to several congregations for their donations of worship furnishings and equipment.

In order to prepare for this initial worship, and in order to initiate a church organization, we are scheduling a meeting in <u>The Bank of Alma (downstairs) on Wednesday, October 24, at 8 P.M.</u> We cordially invite ALL interested parties, namely YOU, to this gathering, hoping that you will join us in initiating a charter membership. At this time we will, with economy of time, choose a name for the congregation, delegate responsibilities for various functions, discuss membership, and take care of several other essential items in our program.

"We are setting out for the place of which the Lord has said, 'I will give it to you.' Come with us and we will do you good; for the Lord has promised good to Israel." (Numbers 10:29-30)



Scrip Program at Peace

As most of you know, Peace has been participating in the Scrip Program since October, 2011. During this past year we have earned over \$1200 solely by members buying gift cards that they then use for normal everyday purchases or as gifts. Cards can be used just as you use cash or a debit card at any participating merchants. They also can be used online at many of the merchants' online ordering sites. The Peace Council authorized purchase of gift cards that are then used to buy church office supplies and the Ladies' Guild has purchased cards for kitchen supplies. Sounds easy, doesn't it? Members contribute to their congregation by continuing their normal buying patterns. And it really is that simple.

It's true that some budgeting and planning is required by members. Carolyn Johnson ably administers the Program for Peace and orders cards every few weeks on Sunday. She receives the cards by Tuesday or Wednesday and distributes them promptly. Think about what you normally purchase — gasoline, food, prescription drugs, an occasional gift for a family member... Check the Scrip Pro merchants list to see the wide variety of cards available. Carolyn can supply you with a list or you can see it online at http://www.scrippro.com. If you have not tried this Program yet, please consider making a small order of one card and giving the Program a try. And, if you are using it, consider additional ways that you could participate. Since Christmas is quickly approaching, perhaps you could purchase a gift card for someone on your list for whom you never know what to buy. With gas prices as they are, a gas card would be a welcome gift for anyone who drives. It's a wonderful way to contribute to Peace without having to take any additional funds from your personal budget.


